NATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

In year 2020, three memorandums of understanding (MOU) were signed between MELTA and the following institutions/ organisations for purposes as stated:

- I. On 13 May 2020, MELTA-Sasbadi MOU was extended for another 12 months. The MOU enables both MELTA and Sasbadi Holdings Berhad to work collaboratively on programmes for teacher development.
 - II. On 15 June 2020, MELTA signed a 1-year MOU with AISEC Malaysia. Following the signing of this MOU, AISEC has been closely featuring collaborative projects with MELTA on their social media such as Speak Up Facebook. MELTA has also conducted training/ workshops for AISEC committee members/ leaders.
- III. On 24 November 2020, MELTA and Oxford Fajar Sdn Bhd signed an MOU to mutually promote better cooperation and collaboration. This MOU signing was attributed by the success of MELTA-Oxford Fajar Webinar Series conducted for teachers, both nation-wide and world-wide.

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

MELTA has partnerships with 13 English Language Teaching Associations in Japan, Taiwan, South Korea, the Philippines, Hong Kong, Thailand, Brunei, Indonesia, Bangladesh, India, and Mongolia.

For 2020, we have been engaging with other ELT associations as we look towards expanding our global partnership for the benefit of our members. Over the years, MELTA has sent representatives to conferences organised by our international partners, and we have also received their representatives at our events.

Earlier this year, the Hornby Trust, UK ran a workshop for ELT associations in Bangkok, Thailand in partnership with the British Council. MELTA was invited to this event. The workshop provided an opportunity for ELT associations in the Southeast Asian region to discuss their plans for the future and potentially engage in cross-border collaboration for the benefit of their members. Discussions with regional ELT associations is on-going and MELTA has participated in several virtual meetings which have been held at regular intervals to discuss wide-ranging issues.

Despite limitations resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic this year, partnerships have remained strong and MELTA looks forward to greater collaboration.



- The year 2020 began with a meeting of 11 Chapters, namely the Penang, Perak, Melaka, KL, Kuantan, Terengganu, Kota Kinabalu, Tawau, Sandakan and Kuching Chapters. Each chapter was asked to organize at least activities.
- The first MELTA Chapter Leaders Meeting was held on 15th February 2020 at the International Languages Teacher Training Institute (IPBA).
- During this meeting, much of the discussion focused on how the Chapters could move forward. Plans were also shared about planned activities for 2020.
- The advent of the COVID-19 pandemic and the restricted movement orders resulted in changes to plans as the Chapters turned to online platforms to conduct their activities.
- The Chapters Bureau recognizes the need for flexibility in allowing Chapters to manage their activities.

- The MELTA Negeri Sembilan Chapter was successfully launched in late 2020.
- The Chapters, through commitment, resourcefulness, and passion, successfully conducted a variety of activities:
 - a) Penang organised face-to-face and online workshops focusing on literature.
 - b) Perak organised webinars on writing essays and the use of instructional strategies.
 - c) Sandakan and Melaka hosted webinars on engaging students through words, maximising students learning outcomes, developing holistic textual engagement and cooperative learning strategies.
 - d) Kuantan organised a face-to-face programme to encourage reading, and also ran webinars on the CEFR Readiness Test and Action Research.
 - e) Terengganu organised a webinar on using virtual platform tools for meaningful learning.
 - f) KL organised webinars showcasing how teachers rose to the challenges of online teaching, and guiding students with literature short stories and poems.

The SIG Bureau in 2020


